Celebrating 75 Years of Saving Places

New Orleans: A Center For Thought-Leadership

As a destination city, New Orleans has the advantage of being the venue for convenings of thought leaders across diverse fields of discipline. This past fall, our city was honored to be selected as the 2024 host for PastForward: the annual conference for the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

PastForward had over 1,100 attendees and 60 sessions including site visits throughout the city. Engaging conference sessions highlighted local expertise including developers, designers, museum directors, and artisans. The President's Award, presented to Camille Strachan, notably honored the work of she and her husband, Duncan, in fighting for the preservation of New Orleans neighborhoods. Another, Wendell Pierce's keynote, recognized his role in the restoration of the Pontchartrain Park neighborhood.

Activism throughout the city was represented across the convention, and the multi-faceted purview of the National Trust Conference was evident in the recognition given throughout. For example, *The National Trust/Advisory Council on Historic Preservation Award for Federal Partnerships in Historic Preservation* was awarded for the Emmett Till & Mamie Till-Mobley National Monument Designation. This monument memorializes the story of 14-year-old Emmett Till's tragic murder and his story's impact to the Civil Rights Movement and the nation as a whole. With this designation and award, the National Parks Service and the National Trust recognize the importance of preserving spaces not just for their architectural history, but also for their significance in our social history.
